INTRODUCTION

- Approved program for household batteries in BC (2010), MB (2011), and QC (2012).
- Historical collections:
 - 2.7 million kg in BC since 2010
 - 325,000 kg in MB since 2011
 - 4.2 million kg in QC since 2012
- YTD collections in all regulated provinces on track to year's collections.
- Accessibility rates higher than 90% in all regulated provinces.



DEVELOPING FEE SCHEDULE: RATIONALE FOR CHANGE

- Recognizes specific provincial strategies and needs.
- Fiduciary duty to reflect the true cost of the program and be financially sustainable.
- Enhances fairness and equity in the marketplace.
- Ensure program enhancement and collection growth while continuing to meet the highest environmental standards.
- QC - Eliminate incongruity related to suspended categories.



DEVELOPING FEE SCHEDULE: GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- No cross-subsidization between categories.
- No cross-subsidization between provinces.
- Simplify the fees schedule and category format for members.
- Ensure easy implementation.



DEVELOPING FEE SCHEDULE: ASSUMPTIONS

- Based on total program cost by province through 2019.
- Based on actual data for sales into the market using Quebec data as a guide.
- Distribution of costs according to 75% primary batteries and 25% rechargeable batteries.
- EHF applied on the units of batteries sold in each of the provincial market.
- EHF modulation based on type, weight and percent of retail price.
- Applied principles and best practices from other jurisdictions.

- Obligations as outlined by the BC, MB, and QC regulations.

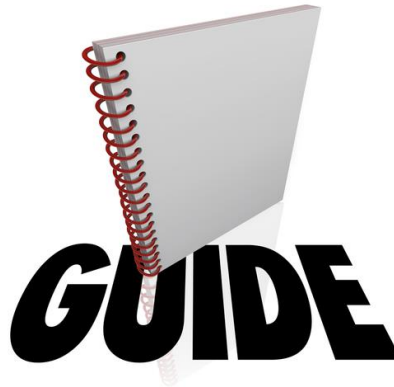
