Recycling your used batteries just got easier thanks to Ontario's new household battery recycling regulation.

Accepted Batteries

Single-use & rechargeable batteries weighing 5kg or less.

Single-Use Batteries

- AA, AAA, C, D, 9-volt & button batteries
- Lithium Primary

Rechargeable Batteries

- Lithium Ion
- Nickel Cadmium
- Small Sealed Lead Acid
- Nickel Metal Hydride

How to Recycle Your Batteries

Recycling is the safest and the most responsible thing you can do with your old batteries.

① SAFELY PROTECT

Reduce the risk of residual charge sparking with these options:

Return to original packaging

Tape terminals

Place in a clear, sealed bag

② SAFELY STORE

Store in a non-metal container.



③ SAFELY RECYCLE

Recycle at a drop-site near you.

Why recycle your batteries?

- ▶ To keep potentially toxic material out of the waste stream, landfill, and away from wildlife
- ▶ To prevent unnecessary fires
- ▶ To conserve and reclaim usable materials to make new products like bicycles, appliances, cookware and golf clubs



What is Call2Recycle?

Call2Recycle® is a national not-for-profit consumer battery collection and recycling program that operates on behalf of obligated battery manufacturers, distributors, and retailers. Call2Recycle utilizes its established network of collection sites to offer Ontario residents access to convenient and accessible battery recycling options.

How is the program funded?

The Call2Recycle program is funded through environmental handling fees (EHFs) remitted by obligated battery producers who have entered into contracts with Call2Recycle to collect and manage used batteries on their behalf.
